

Board Meeting Highlights May 9, 2015

This summary is an awareness tool designed to keep you informed about Peace Library System activities and Board decisions. It is distributed to member councils, library boards and the Peace Library System Board of Directors after each Board meeting.

At the Annual General Meeting, the Board received the 2014 Annual Report and the 2014 Audited Financial Statements, copies of which will be distributed to councils, library boards, and contracting school divisions. The Executive, Personnel, and Plan of Service Committees were elected for the coming year. Veronica Bliska (MD of Peace) was elected Chair of the Board and Ray Skrepnek (MD of Fairview) as Vice-Chair for 2015-2016.

Diana Davidson, Director of the Public Library Services Branch, provided an update on provincial library initiatives relating to the Public Library Network. Her main focus in the weeks ahead will be briefing the new Minister of Municipal Affairs once that person is appointed. She indicated that the Branch will be initiating discussions on the library grants program and on the ILL delivery system currently in place.

The Board reviewed the funding implications for libraries in the proposed 2015-2016 provincial budget (Progressive Conservative), and was hopeful that the new NDP government would continue the commitment to fund libraries at 2014 population figures and increase operating grants by \$.10 per capita. For those library service points where PLS is the Board of Record, and whose funding might decrease due to loss of population, the Board committed to make up the loss in the Library Services Grants from its own system operating grants.

The Board discussed the inaccuracies in population counts for Métis settlements. The 2010 and 2014 official population counts for Paddle Prairie Métis Settlement are very different, which affects the provincial library services grant received by the Paddle Prairie library. The Board has written to the former Minister of Municipal Affairs concerning the issue.

The Technical Services Manager reported that staffing is in place to cover an upcoming maternity leave in the Cataloguing Department.

The Consulting Services Manager reported that plans are well underway for Rural Libraries Conference 2015 which will be held in Grande Prairie on September 24-25. She also reported that 35 member libraries will be participating in the annual Summer Reading Club. The theme for 2015 is *Play* and encourages children to see reading as play.

The IT Services Manager reported that a plan is underway to replace the SCCM server (which deploys software out to libraries) and other servers by the end of the summer.
