

Board Meeting Highlights November 25, 2017

This summary is designed to keep you informed about Peace Library System (PLS) activities and Board decisions. It is distributed to member councils, library boards and the PLS Board of Directors after each Board meeting.

At the annual Organizational Meeting, elections were held for the Executive, Personnel, and Plan of Service Committees. Veronica Bliska (MD of Peace) was elected Chair of the Board and Carolyn Kolebaba (Northern Sunrise County) as Vice-Chair for 2017-2018.

The Board reviewed the 2017 financial forecast. A surplus of about \$163,000 is anticipated, largely due to temporary staff vacancies and a delay in implementing new library websites. Surplus funds will be transferred to capital reserves, with \$50,000 earmarked for website development.

The Board approved the 2018 Operating Budget, which supports the 2016-2018 *Plan of Service*. The budget includes an emphasis on technology training and marketing assistance for member libraries, new websites for PLS and 42 member libraries, and a number of strategies to extend library services to Indigenous communities. It also includes significant building improvements tied to a special provincial infrastructure grant.

The 2018 Capital Budget was approved. It includes the purchase of staff computers, core switches, staff room furniture, workstation chairs, and small building upgrades.

The Board received a report on outreach to Indigenous communities. Many member libraries are making strong efforts to attract Indigenous patrons and raise awareness of Indigenous culture through special collections, new programs and other initiatives.

Revisions to the following policies were approved: Internet & Electronic Mail Acceptable Use; Data Security; IT Services for Member Libraries; Health and Safety; Working Alone; Orientation & Continuing Education for Library Service Points; and Finance Policy for Library Services Points. Two new policies for library services points were approved – Loan of Resources, and Provision of Library Services to Persons Unable to Use Conventional Print Materials.

The Director confirmed two new senior management appointments. Katherine Wiebe, Consulting Services Manager, has been appointed as Assistant Director. Janet Ayles, IT Services Manager, has assumed the role of IT and Technical Services Manager, overseeing both departments.

Beaverlodge Public Library and Elmworth Community Library were the recipients of Excellence in Library Service awards at the annual Rural Libraries Conference.
