

Board Meeting Highlights September 15, 2018

This summary is designed to keep you informed about Peace Library System (PLS) activities and Board decisions. It is distributed to member councils, library boards and the PLS Board of Directors after each Board meeting.

The Board received the final report on the provincial 2017-2018 Indigenous Populations Grant, and a report on outreach activities to be funded by the 2018-2019 Grant. Board members reviewed the *Best Practices for Alberta Public Libraries* relating to Indigenous Service, a new set of guidelines from the Public Library Services Branch. The Board adopted a formal statement to acknowledge its location on land originally occupied by Indigenous peoples.

The Director provided an update on PLS headquarters upgrades funded by the provincial Infrastructure Grant. As of the end of August, all substantial work had been completed and \$734,919 had been spent. Other capital work in progress includes replacement of the west half of the roof and an assessment of boiler functionality.

Revisions were approved to the following policies: Finance; School Services, Resource Sharing Policy for Library Services Points; and Violence and Harassment Policy for Library Service Points.

The Board approved a two-year extension to RMA's 8760 natural gas and electricity contracts to the end of 2022.

The Consulting Services Manager reported that 37 libraries ran summer reading programs and PLS would be compiling statistics on participation. She also reported that the Pronunciator eResource now included modules to assist residents in preparing for the Canadian Citizenship Test.

The IT and Technical Services Manager reported that the network infrastructure upgrade is almost complete. SuperNet and wifi equipment have been replaced at member libraries, and the network has been reconfigured for greater security. Development of new websites for PLS and most member libraries is progressing very well.

The Director reported that she had completed 21 of 27 presentations to update member councils on PLS services and the benefits of System membership.

Elaine Manzer (Town of Peace River), Roxie Rutt (MD of Greenview) and Peter Frixel (Clear Hills County) were recognized for five years of service on the Board.
